He has visited over 60 CW and Revolutionary Battlefields, Museums, and Cemeteries. He was always told of a CW connection and verbal stories, but nothing written down. Upon moving to Springfield and Wilsons Creek BF, finally the "story" could be learned. He is a retired Mechanical Engineer, with R & D managerial experience in aerospace, garden equipment, and truck and trailer suspensions.

John David Kinsley

John David Kinsley was born and raised in Crocker, MO. He spent 28 of his 30-year teaching career at Waynesville High School in Waynesville, MO as a teacher and guidance counselor.

He and his wife Janey, lived on and worked a farm in the Crocker area. However, every summer after the hay was up, they would be on vacation to a Civil War battlefield. He and Janey have visited almost all of the major Civil War sites. Since he has retired from teaching, he has been able to attend many Civil War tours and seminars.

They moved to Republic in 2013 and live next to the Wilson's Creek Battlefield where John David serves as a volunteer. They have one son, David, who lives in Springfield.

Speaker: Lynne Jackson, great-great granddaughter of Dred and Harriet Scott and Founder of the Dred Scott Foundation. The Dred Scott case helped change the landscape and future of this country from a slave holding republic to one that had more potential to be in keeping with the Declaration of Independence. Ms. Jackson delights in sharing this story with young and old, including details of the Scott's personal and family history that have not previously been known. The Dred Scott Foundation's goal is to promote the commemoration,

education and reconciliation of our histories with an eye towards helping to heal the wounds of the past.

In addition to the long list of Ms. Jackson's credentials and honors, she has recently received several other awards. In a 3-part documentary on the Constitution, "A More or Less Perfect Union," Ms. Jackson is featured in the second hour sharing about her great-great grandparents. On October 15, Dred Scott will be given the Legacy award for the Missouri Public Affairs Hall of Fame. Ms. Jackson will be accepting that award in Springfield.

To quote Barbara Bellows who wrote the introduction in the book, "Rich in detail, thoroughly researched, and deeply empathic, Mary Elizabeth Massey's *Ersatz in the Confederacy* tells the story of southern ingenuity during the Civil War. Her broad-ranging study of the home front chronicles the trials of civilians struggling to overcome wartime shortages of such basic commodities as food, clothing, and medicines.

She gives her readers a penetrating insight into the impact of "total war" upon individuals by vividly demonstrating the ways that this conflict touched every life in the South." Mary Elizabeth Massey was quite an accomplished woman and author. Ms. Massey wrote it in 1952 and it has been reprinted.

The book gives an insight about why the shortages happened and what the Confederacy tried to do about it. The blockade of Southern ports played a great part in the shortages as we all know. The Confederate government legislated a lot, but nothing was really put in place for the civilian population. Anything the South had went to the soldiers first and not a lot was left for civilians. It is a good read that has a lot of information about the war and shortages and why they happened that I had no idea about. One substitute for soap, sawdust! That had to hurt!
