

William Piston & John Rutherford

Biographical Sketch of William Garrett Piston

William Garrett Piston retired in August 2017 after teaching for thirty-two years. He received his B.A. and M.A. in history from Vanderbilt University, and his Ph.D. from the University of South Carolina. For three years he chaired the social studies department at the Louise S. McGehee School in New Orleans. He was a member of the faculty of the Department of History at Missouri State University in Springfield from 1988 to 2017, teaching Civil War and American military history. Bill is the author or co-author of a number of books relating to the Civil War, including Carter's Raid: An Episode of the Civil War in East Tennessee; Lee's Tarnished Lieutenant: James Longstreet and His Place in Southern History; Wilson's Creek: The Second Battle of the Civil War; and, with John Rutherford, We Gave Them Thunder, Marmaduke's Raid and the Civil War in Missouri and Arkansas. Bill is the current vice-president, and a past president, vice-president, treasurer, program chair, and Buck & Ball editor, of the CWRT of the Ozarks.

Biographical Sketch of John Rutherford

John Rutherford is originally from Northwest Ohio. His first research related to American Civil War history began at the Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Center Library in Fremont, Ohio.

He is a graduate of Middle Tennessee State University with a bachelor's degree in historic preservation.

John is a local history associate librarian at the Springfield-Greene County Library, where he assists researchers in locating family and regional history. He is co-editor of "This Week in Ozarks History," a regular column in the Springfield (Mo.) *News-Leader*.

Rutherford is a past president of the Civil War Round Table of the Ozarks and past Missouri Department Commander of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

With Bill Piston, John co-authored "We gave Them Thunder": Marmaduke's Raid and the Civil War in Missouri and Arkansas, a book published by the Missouri State University's Ozarks Studies Institute in August 2021.
